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Question: I am distressed by the very thought of anyone suffering eternally. It is particularly troubling to my faith that just as God created man with the capacity for joy, He also gave him the horrible, and I should think unnecessary, capacity to suffer not only in this life but in eternity. And the suffering that awaits the damned is of the most horrible kind: burning forever in what the Bible describes as a "lake of fire." How can you reconcile this with God's goodness?

Answer: Many people have suffered the excruciating pain of being terribly burned in this life. By your reasoning, God is to blame for their suffering because He constituted the human body with nerves that could feel pain. Yet those nerves were designed to warn of disease or other destructive forces at work in the body, and thus to save life.
